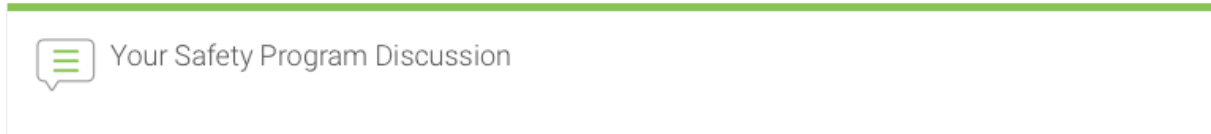


Access forums from your course

There are many ways you can access forums, discussions, and posts.

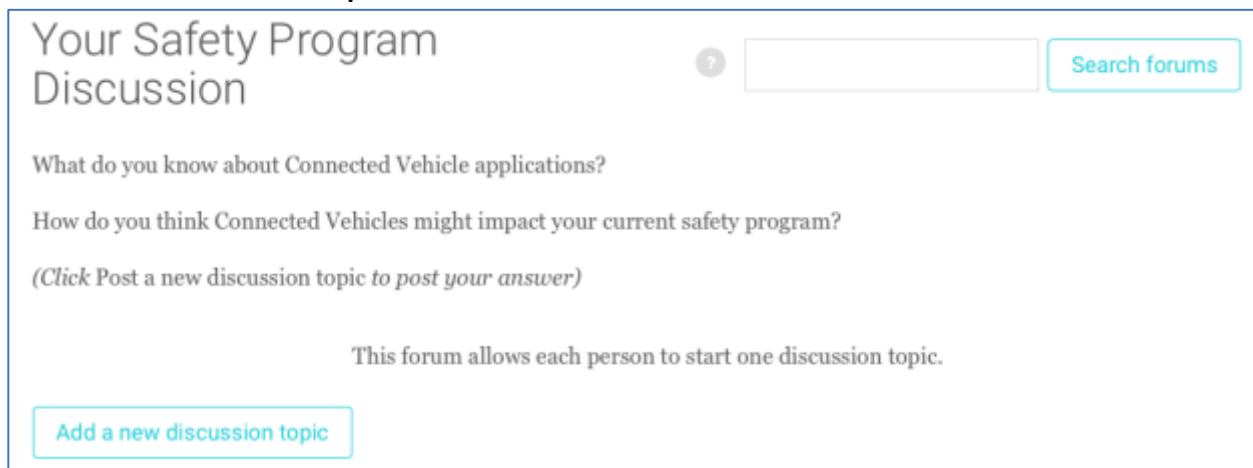
Go to your course and find the *Forum* activity. This is generally how all forum activities appear.



As a participant in any of our courses, you have two options for viewing and staying up-to-date with recent posts.

- **Course footer:** Recent forum posts appear under *Recent Activity* in the course footer. Go to the bottom of the course window to see it.
- **Personal menu:** You can also see recent posts in your personal menu. Select *Menu* at the top of your CITE Training screen in Moodle to open your personal menu.

Add discussion topics



1. From the forum, select **Add a new discussion topic**.
2. Type an appropriate and meaningful **Subject** and **Message**. Use the advanced editor if you want to add formatting to your message.
3. Optionally, attach files by uploading or dragging and dropping, as appropriate. *NOTE: The maximum allowable file size is 2 MB at this time.*
4. Optionally, deselect **Discussion subscriptions** to unsubscribe to the forum. *NOTE: We recommend periodically checking the discussion forums rather than subscribing to each of them as this can quickly become unmanageable.*
